Did you Know?

Chili peppers have been a part of the human diet in the Americas since at least 7500 BC. There is archaeological evidence at sites located in Ecuador that chili peppers were domesticated more than 6000 years ago, and is one of the first cultivated crops in the Americas. Christopher Columbus was one of the first Europeans to encounter them, and called them "peppers" because of their similarity in taste with the Old World black peppers. From Mexico, at the time the Spanish colony that controlled commerce with Asia, chili peppers spread rapidly into the Philippines and then to India, China, Korea and Japan.

Did you Know?

Malbec was originally one of the minor blending varieties of red Bordeaux, where it now accounts for a tiny proportion of local production. But its home now is well and truly in Argentina, where after more than 100 years of nurturing it has come into its own both as a pure varietal, and blended with Syrah, Cabernet Sauvignon or Merlot. However, Malbec is fairly sensitive to its climate. In cooler conditions (in Mendoza, this normally means a higher altitude) it is a thick-skinned grape which develops high acidity and tannic content, giving rise to more robust wines. At lower altitudes the grapes have thinner skins, more juice, and produce wines that are lighter-bodied and more suited to drinking young.

From 1438 to 1533, the Incas used a variety of methods, from conquest to peaceful assimilation, to incorporate a large portion of western South America, centered on the Andean mountain ranges, including, besides Peru, large parts of modern Ecuador, western and south central Bolivia, northwest Argentina, north and central Chile, and southern Colombia into a state comparable to the historical empires of Eurasia.

Did you Know?

Lake Titicaca is situated in the Andes on the border of Peru and Bolivia. By volume of water, it is the largest lake in South America. Lake Maracaibo has a larger surface area, but is often regarded as a large brackish bay due to its direct connection with the sea. It is often called the highest navigable lake in the world, with a surface elevation of 3,812 m. Although this refers to navigation by large boats, it's generally considered to mean commercial craft. At least two dozen bodies of water around the world are at higher elevations, but all are much smaller and shallower.

Lake Titicaca is also a sacred place for the Inca civilization, as the Incan mythology says that the first Inca king, Manco Capac, was born here. According to the Incan mythology, this is the place where the world was created from, when the god Viracocha came out of the lake and created the sun, the stars and the first people.

Arrive in the capital city, Lima, before taking a flight to Cusco, to join a train ride through the sacred valley of Urubamba to the "Lost City of the Incas," Machu Picchu. Explore the ancient city of Cusco and marvel at the nearby ruins of Sacsayhuaman fortress, an imposing example of Inca military architecture. Continue the journey, as it takes you higher into the mountains, to the shores of Lake Titicaca where you will board a boat to the Uros and Taquile Islands. Return to Lima, where the tour ends after spending a day discovering this cosmopolitan coastal city.

The terminus of the Perito Moreno Glacier is 5 kilometres wide, with an average height of 74 m above the surface of the water of Lake Argentino, in Argentina. It has a total ice depth of 170 metres.

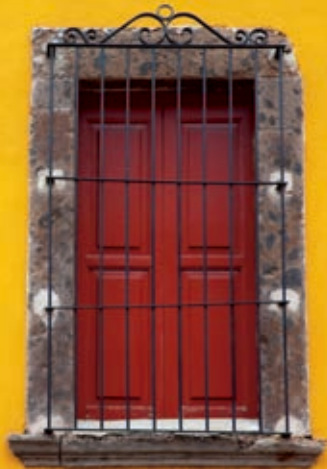

Did you Know?

Born July 6, 1907 in the town of Coyoacán in Mexico, Frida Kahlo survived many difficult events in her life, including contracting polio as a child, a long recovery from a serious car accident, two failed marriages, and several miscarriages.

She used these experiences, combined with strong Mexican and Native American cultural influences, to create highly personal paintings.

Her husband Diego Rivera was a prominent Mexican painter and husband of Frida Kahlo). His large wall works in fresco helped establish the Mexican Mural Movement in Mexican art. Between 1922 and 1953, Rivera painted murals among others in Mexico City, Chapingo, Cuernavaca, San Francisco, Detroit, and New York City.

The Maya is a Mesoamerican civilization, noted for the only known fully developed written language of the pre-Columbian Americas, as well as for its art, architecture, and mathematical and astronomical systems. Initially established during the Pre-Classic period (2000 BC to AD 250), many Maya cities reached their highest state of development during the Classic period (AD 250 to 900), and continued throughout the Post-Classic period until the arrival of the Spanish. Maya influence can be detected from Honduras, Belize, Guatemala, and western El Salvador to as far away as central Mexico.

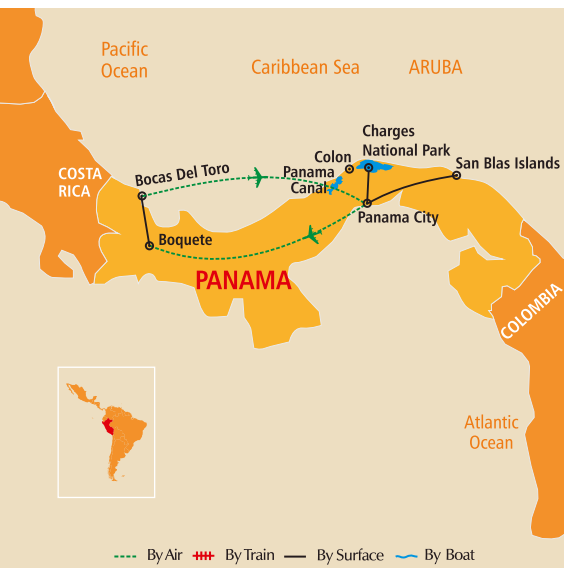

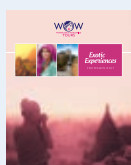
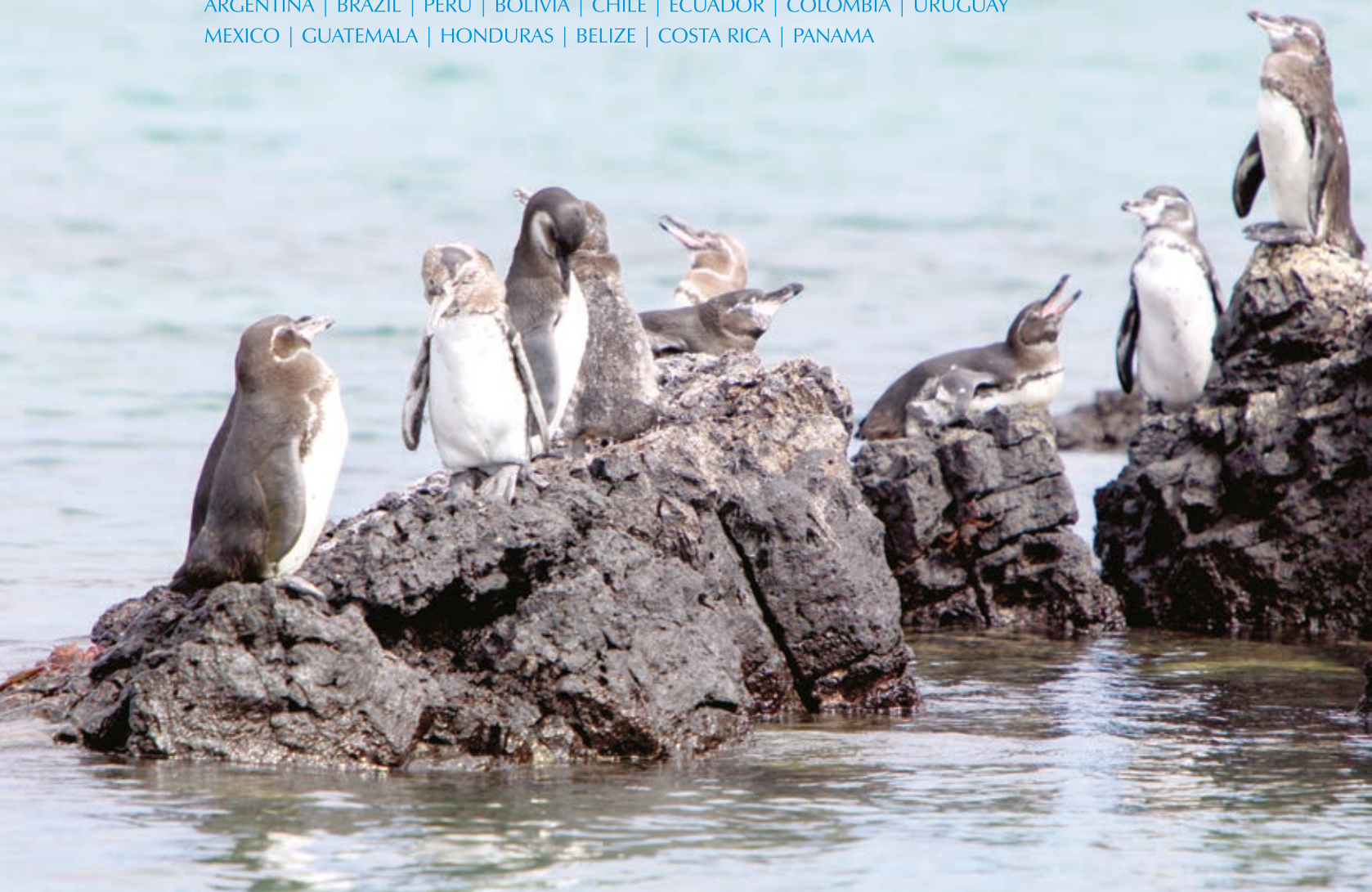
